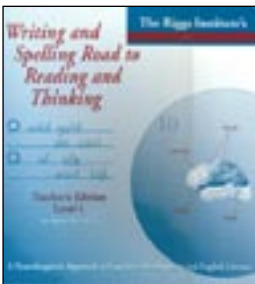

3. Information

About the 2-8 Grade Program

1. The 2-8 grade program is written on a multi-level. That means that each booklet has material for grades 2-8. This is so the whole family in these grades may work from the same books. It is difficult for a busy mother to have 2-6 children and each have a different set of books. Remember, the Bible is written for all ages.

Practical Arts, Missionary Activity, and Field Trip

Practical Arts – Health—find a human skeleton that you can study and learn the names of the 206 bones in an adult body. (Try a college science department.)

Missionary Activity – Help a person with house or yard work who has arthritis during the time you study the bone’s lesson.

Field Trip – Make arrangements to visit with an orthopedic doctor. You might ask questions like: Which bones are broken most often? What are the diseases of the bone you treat most often?

Lesson 10

Bible Class (Family Worship)

Read Luke 3:1-18, discuss.
Memory verses

Day 5

Read comments on the above
verses, discuss.
Review memory verses.

Day 6

Do review questions and say your
memory verses.

Day 7

Enjoy talking about the lesson God
has taught you this week.
